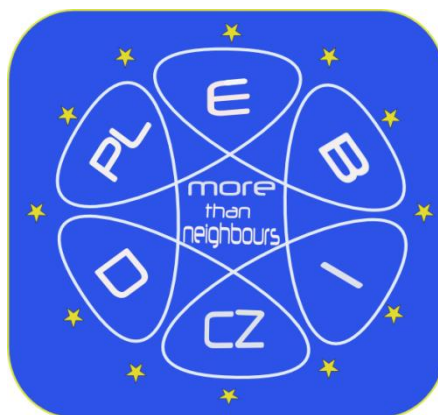

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Who was Hans Friedrich Scholz?

- Hans Friedrich Scholz - a rich and successful cloth merchant
- H.F.Scholz was a factor
- Who was a factor?
- The factor was the middleman between the boss and domestic workers

History of the house

- A photo from the 20'ties-30'ties of the 20th century
- Built in 1771
- The oldest completely preserved wooden building in Liberec
- The house originally stood under a weir and the river Nisa



History of the house

- Hans Friedrich Scholz owned the house between 1771-1794
- Until 1848 - the owners were unknown
- In 1848 the house was the property of Anton Hiebel
- In 1892 the family Tschörner bought the house, they were the owners of a cloth factory



History of the house

- The baroque timbered house
- One of the elements of baroque - massive carved door
- The house shows unique skills of carpenters under mountain Ještěd from the late 18th century



The Present

- Between 1966-1968, the House was owned by Mrs Antonia Pollaková
- The House was protected by the State as a cultural monument
- In 1968 it began to serve as a base for the first three employees of Administration of Jizera Mountains, Protected Landscape Area.



The Present

- The beginning of the seventies threatened to Scholz's house demolition for the construction of the cultural house
- The house stood alone, because the old houses and factories were demolished



The Present

- In 1976 the object was purchased by KNV v Ústí nad Labem
- The house was completely renovated
- Nowadays, the house is 238 years old and it is in a very good condition
- Serves as a workplace of the Administration of the protected area Jizera
- It is a national monument
